

#### <u>Projects and Ideas for Educators – Classroom Video On Demand:</u>

Classroom Video On Demand's content is the ideal resource to use for projects, or as a source for a research paper or essay. Using video for projects will enhance and reinforce a lesson, while keeping the students interested in the activity. Here are a few suggestions on how to use video in conjunction with a lesson.

• **Video homework assignment** – Assign a video for students to watch for homework. Get the conversation started the next time you meet and discuss the video in class.



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- **Create a movie poster** Have students watch a video on a specific subject, and make a movie poster for the video depicting key characters, events or theme in the video. Hang the posters around school or in the library
- **Skits or scene Reenactments** Help students to recreate a key part of a video they've viewed and create a skit or scene reenactment-- this can lead to a great class discussion.
- Change the outcome Have students discuss or write about how they would change a part of a video they viewed—either the ending of a play, or action of a character, setting of a video, etc... Promote discussion on why they would make the change, and how would the change impact the story or issue.
- Advertisement, movie trailer, commercial or Public Service Announcement Ask students to
  watch a video and create their own video advertisement or trailer for the video. Ask them to
  be creative and create excitement so that people watching their advertisement or trailer
  would want to go see the movie! You could also have them create a Public Service
  Announcement and awareness type video on major concerns...i.e. Smoking and Drug hazards;
  Texting and Driving; Bullying; Teen Suicide; Eating Healthy; Animal cruelty, etc... Get the
  posters noticed and hang them around the school.
- Create a Game: Have students watch a video and ask them to take notes as they are watching. Then divide the class in teams and have each team write 5-10 questions about the video. Have the teams ask the other teams questions and give 10 points for each question correct answer. First team to reach 100 points wins. Great way to reinforce content/information in any video, in any subject area; while creating a fun and competitive atmosphere.
- **Create Brochures**: Have students create informational brochures about a video. Whether it be a video about at geographical location, a health issue, a process, etc...
- Compare and Contrast Classics Have students watch one of the Shakespeare videos, or a video that the print/book version may be easily available to them. Ask students to compare and contrast, finding the similarities and differences in the video versus the print version—

watch in segments as you read chapters, for easier comparison :

- Shakespeare: Romeo and Juliet (Item # 1235); Othello (Item # 3030);
   Hamlet (Item # 41685); Julius Caesar (Item # 53751), or Macbeth (Item # 57131)
